**Clinical Education I (CE I):** Provides the student with the first full-time opportunity to apply treatment and evaluation skills gained in the classroom or laboratory during the first two semesters of the professional curriculum. Clinical instruction is provided by qualified, experienced physical therapists at a local or out-of-town facility during eight weeks after completion of the second didactic semester. The emphasis in this clinical period is on (1) mastery of basic treatment, evaluation, communication and observation skills, and (2) development of personal and professional behaviors required of the clinical physical therapist.

**Clinical Education II (CE II):** The focus of CE II is on the development of evaluation and program planning skills. During this full-time eight-week long clinical period at the beginning of the fourth semester, the student begins to focus on the integration of assessment, planning, and implementation of skills previously presented in the professional curriculum. Expectations of student performance increase as patient care planning and treatment skills become more complex in the progression of the curriculum.

**Clinical Education III (CE III):** During CE III, the student participates in the physical therapy program of a selected hospital and/or special treatment center on a full-time work schedule. Clinical instruction and supervision is provided by qualified, experienced physical therapists. In this 10-week clinical period, the student is asked to integrate all knowledge and skills learned in the classroom, laboratory and prior clinical experiences. The emphasis in this period is on:

- complete and accurate patient assessment and diagnosis, including rationale for choice of procedure
- individualized patient treatment program planning with elements of revision
- implementation of treatment plans using effective teaching and communication skills
- apply scientific principles and evidence in the literature to clinical practice

**Clinical Education IV (CE IV):** CE IV is the final twelve week affiliation prior to graduation from the program. Clinical instruction is provided by qualified, experienced physical therapists. The focus on this clinical period is on:

- increased efficiency and accuracy of patient assessments with concentration on clinical decision making
- creative program planning along with appropriate and timely progression of treatments
- early planning for discharge and follow-up care
- apply scientific principles and evidence in the literature to clinical practice
